### A Message from Interim Pastor Lori

Do you *hunger* for a deeper connection to God and one another? Do you *yearn* for the powerful inspiration of the Spirit? Do you *long* to feel the presence of Jesus?

Ash Wednesday is Feb. 13, so this month we enter the season of Lent. Let's make space for encounters with Divine Mystery. Let's take time to notice that we live in the presence of Christ each day. Let's consciously enter the season of Lent together and commit to journeying deeper into faith.

I hope you have already heard that we will be using "Open the Door" by Joyce Rupp as a daily prayer guide and spiritual-practice focus for Lent this year. The prayer guide offers a daily Bible verse, reflection and one simple question to ponder. Use the prayer guide at home for personal meditation each day starting on Feb. 10 (the Sunday just prior to Ash Wednesday). Then, we will share our experiences of prayer and meditation when we gather in the Fellowship Hall each Wednesday for our mid-week Lent gathering (Feb. 20—March 20) at 7 p.m., following the 6:30 p.m. soup supper. (See the order form in the narthex if you want Laura to order the book for you, or order it yourself for your e-reader.)

During this time of interim ministry, as you do the work needed to prepare for calling your next pastor, it is vital to put Christ at the heart of this work. What is the Holy Spirit's intention for you and for this congregation? Will you take time to listen, as individuals and as a faith community, to what Christ is saying here and now? Do you have faith that something will happen when we share our experiences of prayer and meditation with each other – that we will go deeper into our relationship with both God and one another, and that it will matter?

Our Lent journey is grounded in our baptism into Jesus' death and resurrection. What does that look like for the congregation of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church? Let's find out as we continue the journey together; let's open some doors and see who comes in!

### **Interim Ministry Update - February 2013**

As reported at the Annual Meeting, your Council this month is being asked to form task forces to:


- Schedule a class or workshop in handling conflict. In addition, fellowship will begin planning fun events to help GSLC participants get to know one another better.
- Map out a plan to hone the interview and call process for the new pastor.
- Discuss the reasons for having a second worship service and make a recommendation on whether it should continue and, if so, in what form.
- Discuss and make a recommendation for how to support children (whether a Sunday School is viable, or other options).

In addition, opportunities for going deeper into faith will begin in Lent with a focus on personal daily prayer and meditation, supported with group prayer and meditation after the mid-week soup suppers (see related articles, page 5). Spiritual practice is necessary for each of us to grow stronger in faith and live out that faith!

If these areas are addressed in the next few weeks, the Call Committee can be formed after Easter. After short-term visioning has been accomplished (see me if you have a suggestion for how to do this without sticky dots!), the Call Committee can complete the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and submit it to the synod.

It is important that everyone continue to stay involved and informed so that you have a say in how things move forward at Good Shepherd. And don't forget to keep praying for this congregation and for those GSLC exists to serve in Christ's name!

### **JANUARY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

Motions made at the January 2013 meeting were as follows:

- Motion made by Herb Yonge to allow usage of facility by AA for Unity Day Luncheon Meeting on March 2, 2013. Seconded. MSC
- Motion made by Herb Yonge to allow usage of GSLC on Wednesday evenings by Unemployment Action Team group under supervision of Karen Bohling during income tax season. Seconded. MSC
- Motion made to allow Kings Valley Christian School to use GSLC campus as pick-up point for students and families in case of emergency by Herb Yonge. Seconded. MSC

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Treasurer's report shows assets at slightly over \$194,000, and the year ended with \$2751.68 on the plus side. In December, we received contributions in excess of \$1500 in pledged amounts.

We will meet in the Fellowship Hall from 6:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday February 20, 27 and March 6, 13, and 20. All are welcome!

**Open the Door by Joyce Rupp** is a daily prayer guide that will be our spiritual-practice focus for Lent 2013. The prayer guide offers a daily reflection, Bible verse and one simple question to ponder.

Use the prayer guide at home for personal meditation each day starting the week of Ash Wednesday (Feb. 13), and then we will share our experiences of prayer and meditation when we gather in the Fellowship Hall each Wednesday for mid-week Lent (Feb. 20—March 20) at 7:00 p.m., following the 6:30 p.m. soup supper.

Sign up Sunday, Feb. 3 on the poster in the Narthex, or you can call the church office no later than Monday, February 4 end of day, and we will order your copy of **Open the Door.** You can pick it up here on Feb. 10 and begin your Lenten journey. The cost is \$14.00 per book if we order it for you or \$9.99 on your Kindle or Nook. You can also order it yourself if you wish. (Scholarships are available.)

This Lent, let the spiritual practice of prayer and meditation open the door of your heart, because God is knocking there!

### A Message from our Council President

I was grateful for the nomination and vote of confidence to be the President of the Good Shepherd Council for 2013. It is my desire to see us through the time of not having a pastor, to calling a pastor. I believe we will be able to make that happen by 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of this year. It does mean we have work that needs to begin and will feed into the Ministry Site Profile for calling a pastor. Pastor Lori has laid the work out in our congregational teaching January 13th after worship, several emails, and in previous newsletters.

We as a congregation need to step up and get the work started to reach the goal this year. Pastor Lori has laid out some items needing our attention like:

Vision of what God is calling Good Shepherd to become to the community

Call Committee's key learning

How to handle second service

Christian Education

How to handle conflict and build trust

At our first Council meeting on February 12<sup>th</sup>, we will be addressing how best to handle and start this work. Many of you will be asked to participate and provide input. The idea will be to have 2 or 3 Council Members working with members of the congregation to gather input, make a recommendation, and share with the congregation for understanding and alignment for each of the items.

The Sierra Pacific Synod has a vision that was recently created. I personally find it appealing and easy to understand. I have included it as a way for people to see one approach that has been taken. A small (operative word) group was formed who created the vision and brought it back to the Council for suggestions and input. Within a month you can see the finished product. The vision is about "who we are, what we shall be about, and what we will do." It is succinct and easy to understand. Take time and read the Sierra Pacific Synod vision statement on the next page. Good Shepherd's vision should be about us and what we believe God is calling us to become here in this place.

At the Annual Meeting I heard loud and clear the congregation wants feedback about what is going on in the council, and what progress has been made in moving forward to reach our goal of calling a pastor by the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2013. I will make a commitment to provide articles that outline progress, and ask Council Members during announcements to provide additional information. We need to work together to accomplish these tasks so that we can achieve our goal, making sure we pray and ask the Holy Spirit to be with us as we do the work.

Loaves & Fishes catering kitchen: 510 Garcia, Suite H Pittsburg, CA FFF had a busy but lower key month. We served 112 meals at the shelter with help from Awakenings church, New Life church, Tabernacle, and Valley Christian, a meal of ham and cheese sandwiches, turkey green bean and potato soup, green salad, broccoli salad, bananas, cake and cookies. We also furnished people, provided groceries to many, picked up donations, sorted donations, and prepared for the next wave of people we will furnish. We are still looking for strong people with larger vehicles to be on-call for furnishing, and we can use another set to be on-call for picking fruit trees. We could also use help laundering, sorting, bagging and labeling linens. If you can help, please contact us.

Tabernacle school is busy collecting items for their Valentine "Expression of Love" gift bags that will be distributed to needy around the county. If you would like to help with donations, they are collecting bars of soap, new socks, toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, small packs of tissue and hand wipes, wrapped Valentine candy and packaged snacks. Bring donations to Tabernacle or Good Shepherd for this project.

The next time we will meet for our hot lunch will be Saturday, February 16, 2013. We will serve hot dogs, jazzed up beans, broccoli salad, green salad and fruit. If you would like to help sort donations, pack hygiene kits and "food for later" bags, meet us at Good Shepherd at 9:30 AM. If you would like to help serve lunch and pass out donations, meet us at the shelter at noon. If you want to volunteer but can't make it to our lunch, contact us for other volunteer opportunities. We can always use help!
