Clayton Maurice Lee October 18, 1922—July 26, 2012

Clayton Maurice Lee was born October 18, 1922, in rural Gary, Minnesota. He was the sixth of eight sons, who were raised on the family farm. There, his father gave him the nickname "Pete" that would follow him for the rest of his life. Clayton met Ruth in high school. Years later, they would often tell family that they had saved a seat for each other on the school bus as it alternated routes in their small town. When Clayton joined the Army, he was stationed in California and, of course, Ruth moved west to be with him. The two were married January 27, 1943. You might say that their honeymoon phase never quite wore off—for the next seventy years, Clayton proudly referred to Ruth as "his bride."

Clayton served in the South Pacific during World War II. While he was away, Ruth returned to Minnesota, where she gave birth to Linda in 1944. A son, Gary, was born in California in 1946. After the war, Clayton and Ruth returned to Minnesota once again, where they ran the Waukon Country Store and welcomed a second son, Ross, in 1949. Always adventurous, they ultimately decided to settle in California.

The Lee family, now with five members, moved to Richmond for a time before Clayton and Ruth bought their first home in Concord. They joined Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in 1954, and Clayton was particularly proud that they were charter members of the congregation. He was also a member of the VFW, Sons of Norway, and Concord Elks Lodge. Clayton sold Fords in Martinez before joining the State Farm Insurance Company, where he was a top-producing owner/agent for more than 25 years before retiring in 1986. Once work was done, it was time to play—and they made sure to enjoy retirement. Clayton and Ruth traveled extensively throughout Europe and regularly vacationed to their cabin in Cazadero, California, and retirement home in Mesa, Arizona. Clayton drove their motorhome throughout the country, including two major trips that covered the Lower Forty-Eight states. Clayton was blessed in his retirement years with his loving "bride" and large family.

For the last 15 months of his life, Clayton lived at Montecito Senior Living in Concord. He passed away July 26, 2012. Clayton is survived by his wife of almost 70 years, Ruth Lee; daughter Linda Mahloch and son-in-law Gary; son Gary Lee and daughter-in-law Barbara; grandchildren Cheryl, John (Pam), Jason and Denise; as well as great grandchildren Christopher (Kaitlyn), Matthew, Emily, Lindsey, Quinton, Clayton, Hunter and Madison. He was predeceased by son Ross Lee in 1996 and his seven brothers. Clayton's family thanks God for bettering their lives by sharing in his.

On Behalf of our family, we would like to thank everyone for all the prayers, cards and phone calls we received after my father passed away. There was a lot of work before my dad's memorial service that didn't go unnoticed, patching and painting in the fellowship hall, cleaning the kitchen and of course preparing and serving the luncheon. We are very grateful for our church family.



How were funds used this month: Purchased groceries at Sam's for FFF lunch at shelter & for distribution of groceries throughout month, purchased air mattresses for back-up when we have no beds in storage for furnishing, purchased cookware for those we furnish, purchased extra groceries at the 99 Cent only store to refill pantry

Who is providing assistance and what duties were performed for <u>FFF</u>: Congregation members picked up donations and recycling at Tabernacle school, distributed groceries through church office and through car delivery.

We received donations of clothing, hygiene items and household furnishings, moved donations from church office by members and non-members cars to FFF storage,.

Sorted incoming donations, drafted and emailed monthly lunch calendar for shelter to participating churches, city and county offices, and charitable organizations, delivered groceries to woman in Concord, wrote newsletter article, coordinated with shelter manager on clients who will be moving soon.

We contacted a single man to determine furnishing needs, distributed groceries to large family in Antioch, picked up computer desk in Pittsburg for use by GSLC treasurer and finance secretary, delivered groceries to disabled woman in Concord.

Met with church members who were donating linens, and clothing from client's estate, delivered lamp and groceries to woman in Concord, supervised student volunteers sorting and organizing linens for community service hours, contacted kitchen manager of Loaves & Fishes catering kitchen.

Worked on pantry application for food bank, declined offer of king size bed due to transportation, storage and placement concerns, discussed with office administrator clearing of FFF supplies, clothing and computers that will be necessary for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hour usage by outside group.
