Rev's Reflections

There are two kinds of time we as the people of God experience. The first, is Chronos, which is the Greek word from which we get our English word "chronology"; this is clock time, calendar time. Chronos is one day after another. The other kind of time we experience is "Kairos"; this is God's time that is not dependent on the calendar but on the situation. God always seems to come just in time. "Kairos" means "the appropriate time or season." God comes in "Kairos" no matter what the calendar and clock say. The Christmas seasons with all their hope and joy comes again both on time and just in time.

This year the Christmas Seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany are not only right on time by the calendar, but just in time. With all the news stories of terrorist attacks we really need a season of joy. This season brings joy because there is hope in Jesus. We of course are always in need of "tidings of comfort and joy," and we are always called to "repeat the sounding joy," the very "joy to the world" which comes from knowing Jesus alone. But there seems to have been so much tragic news recently, and while there has been much good news, it's often lost beneath the more prominent headlines of war and threats, fightings within and fears without.

The first Christmas was also just in time. St. Paul says, "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law" (Gal 4:4). For the whole world, this "fullness of time" had come. Time to end the reign of sin and death. Time to begin the restoration, renewal, and redemption of all God's creation. This time of restoration, renewal, and redemption began with the first Advent of Christ, and will be complete at the second Advent of Christ, when "He shall come again in glory to judge the living and the dead." Our joy is two fold; God has come into the world and will come again.

It's a blessing when this season of hope and light comes to lift our spirits from tragedy, anxiety, fear, anger, and even ungodly thoughts of revenge and hatred. Glory to God in the highest - the Christmas Seasons this year come just in time.


