"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Mathew 25:40)

It's hard to believe that I have only been here for six months. I am still learning about the fine folks of Good Shepherd and what it means to be your pastor. What I have learned is that we are a community with resources that does very well serving the poor and "least of these" through our Friends Feeding Friends Ministry. That ministry hands out around 600 bags of food on a monthly basis to those who would go without.

In my short time here, I have noticed that we have a need among us. We have seven people on our homebound list. These people are unable to come to worship for various reasons and are confined to their home or a care facility. They have been part of this congregation for many years and are unable to be with us in person. Being away from the church you have called home for so long can be lonely, isolating, and discouraging.

So, I am looking for people to be a part of our visitation ministry with our homebound.

Here is how you can help:

- I. Volunteer to call on a homebound member in person.
- 2. Send encouraging notes.
- 3. Deliver church bulletins/newsletters.
- 4. Be their friend.

We are looking for people who:

- I. See value in homebound people.
- 2. Are willing to spend time with our homebound.
- 3. Can listen with empathy and compassion.
- 4. Are positive, friendly, and encouraging.
- 5. Will pray regularly for those they visit.

A Message from our Council President

April was a terrific month with the wonderful Easter celebration. It was terrific to see a good number of folks at our combined service. And the delicious brunch provided by our Fellowship Committee. Thank you everyone who helped set up, provided food, served and cleaned up.

It was a truly wonderful day. As we exited the church we were greeted with much needed rain drops. So many drops the Easter Egg Hunt had to be relocated to the sanctuary!

I want to thank Linda Rodemsky for mowing the "lower 40." Thanks Linda. Want to thank Rev, Jon Moss and Tony Rogelstad for all the hard work preparing Pioneer House for our pastor and his family.

As you know we have purchased an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). On Saturday, April 18th we trained several of our ushers and others that wished the training. It only takes about 10 minutes to learn Hands Only CPR and how to use the AED. We want all of our ushers to be trained.

If you did not attend the training and wish to learn this important skill please call the office and let Laura know. She will make a list, and when we have at least 10 people we will conduct another class.

As you all know there is a need for us to conserve water. Several months ago Nils Anderson met with a representative of Contra Costa Water and they did an audit of our water system. There were a number of things that needed to be addressed: broken water line, ineffective sprinkler heads, etc. Some of the items have been fixed and we have reduced our consumption considerably. But we need to do more.

Our Property Committee will continue to address the water situation, and we will continue to reduce our usage. Our last billing period reflected a reduction of 1200 gallons per day from the same period last year, from 1900 gallons per day to 700.

On Thursday, May 21, we will be having our second Healthy Start meeting with Pastor Mark Price. Our Council and the Call Committee members will be attending this meeting.

Friends Feeding Friends was inspected by the food bank on Thursday, April 30. We passed with flying colors!

The walk through included physically inspecting our shelving and food storage, checking food temps in our freezers and refrigerators, and inspecting our permit, records, and my food safety manager certificate.

The inspector was impressed with our operation and he said we are doing everything right. He especially liked the fact that we deliver to housebound and disabled people who have no family or friends nearby. He said FFF is a progressive model for other agencies to learn from and study. We are reaching people who would otherwise go hungry.

He said he was in complete awe of what we accomplish and how many people and how many diverse population groups we reach. And he himself has a lot of non-profit work history having worked for Catholic Charities.

April 2015 - Council Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Herb Yonge.

Members present: Herb Yonge, Nils Anderson, Donna Albrecht, Tony Rogelstad, Greg Buchholz, Jon Moss, and Vicki Smiglewski.

Absent: Leone McCullough, Laura Mott, Emilie Patton, and Pastor Jeremy. Visitor: Rich Veal.

Rich Veal, an instructor for the Clayton Community Emergency Response Team taught Council Members how to do hands-only CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and how to operate our new AED (Automated External Defibrillators) in the event someone stops breathing while on our campus. Our AED machine is stored in the church office copy room during the week and is to be taken to the Narthex at the close of business on Friday by Laura Mott or Pastor, and returned after the completion of the second service on Sundays by the COD.

Recognitions: Herb recognize Tony Rogelstad, Jon Moss, and Pastor for their work on Pioneer House, and all those who worked on Easter Services and Brunch. Vicki was recognized for her work on the butterflies for the sanctuary for Easter morning along with those who helped, including Gary and Linda Mahloch; Jim, Carin, and Doug Olson; and Joe and Laura Carlson. Joe Carlson, Gordon Monroe and Paul Rusch were recognized for doing the annual financial audit. Emilie sent in her recognition of Choir leader, Ondine Young, for bringing in great musicians for our Easter service.

The May Council meeting has been moved forward to May 19.

Nils and a representative of Contra Costa Water District evaluated water use on Good Shepherd's campus. As a result, many leaks have been found and fixed and our water bill shows a significant reduction in use. However, we are still using approximately 700 gallons a day.

Renovations on the Parsonage are nearly complete.

At Pastor's request, the altar will be moved forward on the platform to provide more space for moving around, and a handrail will be installed in the back for safety in going up and down the stairs there.

The overhead lights in the sanctuary have been checked, and parts have been ordered for those needing repairs.

There was a long discussion about how we as a congregation should proceed in supporting Friends Feeding Friends.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE—NEPAL AREA EARTHQUAKE


