#### A Message from Interim Pastor Lori Eickmann April 2014

The people praising Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey threw their cloaks on the ground before him and waved palm branches, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

OK, let's break this down:

- \* "Hosanna!" means "Save us!" It is also a word of praise.
- \* The procession into Jerusalem is a dangerous political act something a conquering hero would do.
  - \* Riding a donkey is a sign of humility and peace.

Jesus is hailed as a prophet – one who fulfills what was foretold: "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey." (Mt. 21:5) Jesus is the savior the people have been praying for – but not in the way they expected. They hoped for a king who would overthrow the "bad guys" and put the "good guys" in power.

As do we. Wouldn't we love a savior who would dislike the same people we dislike, and side with us? Yeah, *that's* justice, right?

Except that it's not God's justice.

Jesus opens our eyes to God's justice, which comes from seeing with the eyes of Christ and serving with the heart of Christ.

"This is my body, given for you. This is my blood, shed for you."

This month the gospel readings will place us in the palm procession, at the Last Supper, at the foot of the cross. And outside a tomb...

What do we think, feel, see, hear, smell and taste when we put ourselves in these places? What are we asking for when we shout "Hosanna! Save us!"? What do we experience in the bread and wine Jesus offers? What do we experience in the shadow of the cross? What do we experience outside that tomb, its stone door rolled aside?

When we shout "Hosanna!" on Palm/Passion Sunday (April 13), we do so with an understanding of the true salvation we have in Christ: that God's self-giving love overcomes all human division and pain, and we are called to live in and out of that love. So when we join with believers everywhere shouting "Hosanna! Save us!" that day, we will bring our God's Global Barnyard banks up to the altar as part of worship, offering up our change and our hearts to help change the lives of those in need of food and clean water.



Save us! Save us who are hungry and thirsty and homeless and lonely and sick and suffering! Save us from greed, apathy and self-centeredness! Save us from all that separates us from you, God, and from one another and from the wholeness you desire for all creation!

#### "Some Bunny Loves You"





Confidentiality is very important for the integrity of the process and to protect the candidates. Each of us can support the process by praying for the call committee – Nils, Candace, Greg, John and Aimee – and for the candidates.

And pray for yourselves, too! Pray that Good Shepherd is ready for a new pastor who will bring some change – that you will be open to hearing new ideas and sharing some of your own. Pray for the ability to trust, knowing that you and the new pastor will not always agree on everything, but that each of you have the desire and the ability to talk things through. Pray for the wisdom to see that pastor and people together determine how well communication, programs and ministries evolve – that everyone in the community plays a role in how effectively the community operates. (Remember that the opposite of "everyone plays a role" is "it's the scapegoat's fault"!)

In other words, pray not only for "the right pastor," but for being "the right people." By the power of the Spirit, we are all able to serve God's purposes together.

Finally, as I mentioned near the end of last year, I may not be able to remain at Good Shepherd all the way until your new pastor arrives. There are still congregations waiting to start intentional interim ministry. Since we have finished the work of interim ministry – looking at GSLC's history, identity, leadership shifts, and new directions – you could be well served by someone who doesn't necessarily have training as an intentional interim. I'll keep you posted, and meanwhile, I look forward to us walking together through the remaining days of Lent and anticipating Holy Week and the Easter celebration to come!
