## A Message from Interim Pastor Lori Eickmann

In Advent we anticipate Christ coming into the world.

If that statement conjures idealized visions of tiny baby Jesus sleeping snugly in a manger, consider our gospel text for the first Sunday of Advent:

*“There will be signs in the sun, the moon and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see ‘the Son of Man coming in a cloud’ with power and great glory...”*

What does it mean that Christ is coming into the world?

It’s interesting to note that our Advent gospel readings from Luke are, well, backward. We read from Luke 21 on the first Sunday of Advent, from Luke 3 on the next two Sundays, and, finally, from Luke 1 on the last Sunday of Advent. As we look forward to the Christmas celebration, we naturally think of Christ coming into the world 2,000 years ago in Bethlehem. But we are also reminded that Christ will come again – in the fullness of time – to draw all creation, finally, into God’s reign. And in between these two comings, we are called to “be on guard” and “be alert” and “prepare the way” for the one coming who baptizes with the Holy Spirit and with fire!

Alrighty then, people of Good Shepherd: How do we prepare the way for Jesus?! Are we alert to the signs of Christ’s reign breaking into our lives? Are we the signs of Christ’s reign breaking into the lives of those who hunger for food, dignity, healing, companionship, and God’s grace? Are we, too, hungry for the good news that the power and glory of Emmanuel (“God with us”) are used not for personal gain, but to bless each and every child of God?

This Advent season, let us anticipate the signs that Christ is coming into our hearts, into this community of faith, and into this world each day. In the midst of wrapping gifts and planning parties, let’s remind one another that Christ is coming – yesterday, today and tomorrow. God is doing something new in our lives; be alert!

*“...Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.”*

## Interim Ministry Update Dec 2012

As we enter Advent, we will take a break from our interim focus and give our attention fully to anticipating Christmas. But here is an update on our interim time so far and what could happen in the new year.

I have finished my 1-to-1 talks with council members, several members of the congregation, and even some random people I've encountered who have former ties to Good Shepherd. In addition, I have read many documents: a 2006 study, the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary booklet, the results of Pr. Russ' survey of the congregation, your previous Ministry Site Profile, exit interviews and more. After reading all this, I can see why many of you are tired of "studying and being studied"!

So .... I have decided **not** to survey you further. Instead, I will find a way to present to the congregation a summary of what's already been named (and sticky dots will **not** be involved!). We can look at that together and decide where to go with what everyone already knows; or perhaps we'll discover something we don't know...

Whatever we do together, the point to keep in mind is this:

The time of interim ministry is less about the new pastor you will call and more about YOU as a congregation. It is a time to look at what goes on here that helps the mission to which you've been called – to be the face of Christ in Concord and beyond. It is also a time look at what might impede that mission. When this is clear and you are energized in this congregation's particular call, you are more likely to attract a pastor who will share your vision.

Keep chatting with me after worship so I can continue to learn more names.

## Message from the President . . . .

**Mark 12:30-31** (NIV) <sup>30</sup> Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.<sup>31</sup> The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

---

How can you Love without some kind of relationship with the person that you say you Love? Right now, my Spiritual Journey is all about exploring "How can I Love someone that I don't know? I have been working on my relationships in earnest with God and my family for the past year and have seen changes in the way I think about each. You may ask, "What do you mean and what are you doing when you say you are working on the relationships?"

My relationship with God is based on not just reading the Bible but taking time to discern what do the Biblical words mean and how do they speak to me. Also, I am using daily Prayer as a way of strengthening my relationship with God. Thanking Him for the many Blessings he has given me, Blessing like being alive, breathing, tasting, smelling, seeing, touching, and the ability to use my free will and to trust God. I am using Sermons as a way of strengthening by relationship with God by letting the Word help me to understand what God wants from me and for me. Isn't that what you and I both love about being Lutheran? Our sermons are Bible based.

In our Lectio Divina, forty five minutes of Prayer every Sunday from 10:00 to 10:45 a.m., we read scripture, meditate on the Word, Pray, and share what came to us during the silence (Meditation and Prayer). "Be Still and Know that I am God." The discussion is rich, full, robust, and caring about our Church, and the people in it. To be able to have discussions with fellow Christians in ways that grow my faith is a miracle. Wouldn't you agree? I am blessed to be able to be surrounded by fellow Christians easily found at church, and more and more I can find them here at work.

As for working on my relationship with my family, Richard and David, in this area I am doing several things. One is, I want to know who are their friends and why have they chosen them to be their friends. In this search for understanding, I get to see some of their core values and I find a deeper love for both of the boys. As for their friends, I find they

become my friends in a different way. I see the respect they have for me, the earnest care they have for me by offering to do things that say "I care about you." Is that a God Wink!!!!

As we are preparing for Advent and Christmas, we begin to think about those who are less fortunate than you and I. We see the Care Bears on the tree with items people would like for Christmas. Basic necessities! Is it possible to do two things in addition to the basic gift? Can we buy the person something personal in addition to their necessity gift? And can we send them a box of cookies with each gift? This idea actually came from Dan Pierson. He wanted the congregation to bring in their metal cookie tins. And then, have some of us bake and fill up the tins with cookies. Each Care Bear receiver gets a necessity gift, a personal gift, and a can of cookies. Sounds sweet to me, how about you? If you would like to donate either cookies or tins, call the church office. All this needs to be done by December 22, 2012.

May your journey through Advent be filled with the Love of God and the peace given by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

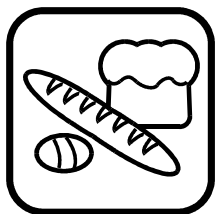
