#### A Message from Interim Pastor Lori Eickmann February 2014

"You are the salt of the earth," Jesus says in a series of teachings in Matthew's gospel account that the church calls The Sermon on the Mount. "You are the light of the world." (Mt. 5:13-14)

We are salt. We are light. And Jesus calls us to be fishers of people. (Mt. 4:19)

Recently during the children's message we considered that just as we need equipment to catch fish – a fishing rod and bait – we also need to be equipped to speak about our faith and to show Christ's love with our actions. We need help and inspiration to stay spicy and let our lights shine!

Bible study is an important way to stay rooted in the story of God's love and faithfulness to humanity, so, as you know, a new threeweek adult class is coming this month (see pg. 2). The story of God and God's beloved people, revealed in sacred Scripture, is an Epiphany – it shines the light of hope throughout the world and in our hearts. We are part of the on-going story of God and God's beloved people; we see ourselves reflected in Abraham and Sarah's trust in God's promises, Peter's zeal for following Jesus and Peter's lapse in courage, old Zebedee's inability to get out of the boat, and Mary Magdalene's faith in and witness to the Christ.

If you use home devotionals, such as "Christ in Our Home" or an online daily devotion that follows the lectionary, you'll notice some challenging texts this month: Jesus' teachings not only about salt and light, but about anger, adultery, divorce and loving our enemies. The challenge is to dig below the surface of Jesus' sayings to discover neither trite moralism nor a demand for unattainable perfection – but rather, grace-filled guidance.

Bible study can comfort, challenge and inspire us. It equips us to consider the theology of popular movies or books so that we can discuss with others why we agree or disagree with the depictions of God and Christ presented. And that leads us to consider again our own actions in light of our call to follow the path of Christ.

So all are welcome to our next adventure in Bible studies! On **Feb. 9, 16 and 23**, I'm offering a class between worship services (9:45-10:45 a.m.) called **"Rediscovering Feminine Images of God in Scripture."** We will look at Old and New Testament texts and the Judeo-Christian history of language for the Divine.

After that, one Wednesday during Lent (which begins in March), there will be a session on the **book** of Job.

An on-going women's study opportunity at Good Shepherd is the **Ruth Circle** that meets monthly (except for the summer) at 10 a.m. every second Thursday. (Is there interest in a men's study group?) Also, the **confirmation** students have been looking at Old Testament stories during their fall semester, and now we are reading from the New Testament.

We are salt. We are light. We are fishers of people. We need help to do that. Inspiration and guidance are available when we read and study the story of God together.

# January 2014 Council Meeting Notes

Our Good Shepherd Council met on January 14 at 7 p.m. in Fellowship Hall.

Sue Hertless recognized and thanked the Council members who will be leaving after the congregational meeting, including Jim Olson for his work on the Property Committee, Linda Rodemsky for her work in Social Ministry, Victor Olmedo for his work with Youth and Laura Mott for her work with Evangelism and Christian Education.

Betty Jacobsen was recognized for making communion bread and especially for making enough for the two weeks she would be on vacation.

Council members approved allowing the Crisis Nursery to have their volunteer recognition dinner in Fellowship Hall on April 14 and approved Alcoholics Anonymous to hold their Unity Day in Fellowship Hall on March 1, 2014 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The United Methodist Church has hired a youth director and is talking with Council members about possible joint activities.

The Synod will hold a Social Media Workshop at St. Paul's Lutheran in Lodi on February 8, 2014. The workshop will focus on how to use social media in a church environment. If interested in participating, contact Pr. Lori.

Pastor Lori reported on problems with the computer programs used to post congregational profiles to be seen by potential applicants throughout the ELCA. Our profile was submitted on December 23. As of this date, the problem continues. Pr. Lori will discuss this at the annual meeting. (Editor's note: The problem has now been solved and the profile is now posted!)

Jon Moss closed the lease contract for the cell tower. The contract is with SBA, the tenant is to be AT&T. The lease is for thirty years.

Sue asked the members leaving the council for their advice for those remaining. Linda Rodemsky said we shouldn't lose focus. Good Shepherd is God's church and we need to focus on God, not just personal agendas. Jim Olson thanked everyone who has helped. Sue Hertless wants us to have youth on the Council to give them a voice. Laura Mott added to be open to working together and finding new ways to serve the congregation and do God's work with our hands.

### Interim Ministry Update February 2014

At the congregational Annual Meeting, you heard a report from your Call Committee chair, John Mott, saying that Good Shepherd's pastoral search is "live" – which means information on GSLC is available to be viewed online by pastoral candidates across the nation. In addition, Bishop's Associate Pr. Nancy Nelson previously had said she has a couple of local candidates in mind for you.

Pr. Nancy expects to have names for the Call Committee at the end of this month. I noted the basics of this process in a recent sermon, but it bears repeating: Pr. Nancy contacts local candidates who may be a good fit for you, and, in addition, she is contacted by candidates who have read your online information. She sends Good Shepherd's Ministry Site Profile to appropriate candidates, and they get two weeks to consider your profile, examine their sense of call and prayerfully discern whether they want to be a candidate for Good Shepherd.

Everyone wants to know how fast the interview process will go. I can give you an idea of the factors involved, but let me reiterate that speed isn't the goal! This is not a time to cut corners, and your Call Committee has no intention of doing so. They have been meticulous at each step and are determined to bring the same integrity to the interviewing. That said, the factors impacting how the process moves along include: how many candidates are interviewed (it takes longer to interview five people than three, of course); whether they are local or are from out of the area or even out of state (in which case, travel arrangements play a role); and whether the candidate is now serving a congregation or is between positions (if not currently serving, he or she may have a more flexible schedule).

Please support your Call Committee with your prayers, your thanks and a positive attitude. Don't forget to pray for the candidates, too. Just think – there is a pastor out there who will be praying for and about Good Shepherd at the same time you are praying for them. May the Holy Spirit bring you together in a blessed partnership!
