#### **Rev's Reflections**

#### "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that Jesus said, "Follow Me."

The definition of a Christian is simply a person who follows Jesus. One can believe in God, in heaven and hell, in being a good person; but, none of that makes them a Christian. Jesus is the dividing line between Christian and non-Christian.

Jesus calls individuals into relationship with himself and his family. I think we often forget the "and his family" part because that 's what the church is. A Christian church is the family of Jesus who together follow Jesus wherever he may lead. One can't have one without the other; you can't have Jesus without his family. One can't have complete relationships in the church without Jesus. "My brothers and sisters," Jesus said, "are those who hear the word of God and do it." "You are my friends," Jesus said, "if you do what I command you. And this is my command – that you love one another."

Christian love is not about a sentimental feeling, but sacrificial faithfulness toward those whom we are in relationship with. It is faithfulness to Jesus' word, faithfulness to Jesus' family, faithfulness to his creation. I am thankful for the Holy Spirit that produces within us the very thing we are not humanly capable of doing: love. Love is a verb. Love is a doing, a sacrifice on the behalf of, a faithfulness in spite of, which is impossible without the grace of God in Jesus Christ.

We witnessed love this last month when the family of those killed in Charleston forgave the killer. We witness love when those who rejoice in the supreme court decision to allow same sex-marriage nationwide continue in dialogue with those who disagree. We witness love when we see people sacrifice their agenda and will in order to be in relationship with those with whom they strongly disagree.



Council Meeting was held on June 9, 2015

Present: Herb Yonge, Emilie Patton, Nils Anderson, Donna Albrecht, Tony Rogelstad, Pr. Jeremy Serrano, and Jon Moss.

Absent: Vicki Smiglewski, Laura Mott, Greg Buchholz, and Leone McCullough.

Guest Present: Jamie Rodemsky.

Recognitions: Jon recognized Tony Rogelstad for handling the updates of the lights in the sanctuary; Tony recognized Jamie Rodemsky for helping get the job done. Pastor recognized Tony for fixing the trap door in the parsonage. Emilie was recognized for her awesome Pentecost cake and for subbing as choir director. Pastor recognized Laura Mott, Pamela Dietz, and Lynne Davies for purchasing items and using them to decorate the sanctuary for Pentecost. He also recognized Linda Rodemsky, Rosemary Fassl, Tracey Rentner-Glen, Jessica Serrano, and Aimee Olmedo for their readings in different languages for the Pentecost service.

A letter was received from SHARE Food Pantry thanking us for our \$650 donation to their program.

Jaimie Rodemsky proposed that special cable be run, connecting the Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall and the Office to prepare for technological and security updates. He and Larry Huddleston will do the work. The Council approved \$808.98 to pay for supplies.

During summer services at 9:30 a.m., Tom Deans Flegel will lead the musical liturgy, and communion will be done by intinction. Pastor will be on vacation July 3-11 and August 3-14.

Youth Protection Policy: The discussion from the last meeting was continued. Volunteers do not have to be current members of GSLC, but they should have been attending regularly for the last six months and be willing to have their fingerprints and background checked.

Concern was expressed about the Firearms section of the Policy as there is interest in creating a small group at GSLC for the purpose of sport shooting. The current policy reads, "With the exception of law enforcement officers, firearms and other dangerous weapons are not permitted during church activities." Nils moved and Tony seconded that the following words be added. "except for properly supervised shooting activities at properly licensed sites."

Finance: Nils reported that GSLC passed its financial audit with flying colors.




