

But I, through the abundance of your steadfast love, will enter your house, I will bow down toward your holy temple in awe of you. Lead me, O Lord, in your righteousness. (Psalm 5:7-a, NRSV)

Dependence is a difficult thing to internalize because we are constantly pushed toward independence. For Americans independence seems to be the highest ideal. It is sung about in our national anthem, it is spoken of in national debates, and it is hailed on July 4.

From childhood we are rightly reared from dependence toward independence, but in adulthood dependence is seen as an arrested development.

Yet, the Psalmist example shows us that dependence is the way of faithfulness. He cries out, "through the abundance of your steadfast love." The Psalmist can act only because he is dependent on God as the originator of his action. He cries out, "Lead me, O Lord..."God acts first, and then continues to show the way. The way of faith is not independence but dependence that God will act first.

We are dependent from birth moving toward independence but we are called to move back to dependence in faith.

The way of faith is to rely on God as the first actor in our lives. God is the one who gives us trust. It is only through God's abundant love that we are able to enter God's presence. We need God to lead which means we rely on God and not ourselves.

The maturing of faith is the move from independence to dependence. We must abandon ourselves in order for faith to take hold. God is there to catch us when we give up our independence and depend solely on Jesus.

Ultimately, God empowers us through steadfast love and we receive that love through dependence.

#### **Resurrection . . . Our Sister Parish**

By God's Grace when Good Shepherd asked for a sister parish they were given Resurrection Lutheran Church in San Salvador, Bishop Merdardo Gomez's Church. Bishop Gomez is the Lutheran Bishop in Central America.

He takes serious Jesus command to "feed the hungry, house the homeless, cloth the naked and care for the sick." El Salvador is a very poor country and the money the church has is used to support a clinic, a homeless shelter, and a school.

Resurrection Lutheran began in 1972. It has 5 pastors but only one gets paid a mere \$100 a month. The church has about 300 members and averages 80 to 100 worshippers a week. They currently hold worship services in the house where the clinic is located. Their original church was an old house that was bombed during El Salvador's civil war and was demolished to make room for a simple, but beautiful church that is safe for their people to come and worship.

In communicating with Christian Ayala, our contact at Resurrection, he indicated that right now they are at a point in construction where they need a roof. Once the roof is completed they will have a place to worship that represents new hope and God's goodness as they firmly believe God will provide.

The Evangelism Committee is having a vendor fair to raise money for our sister parish; but seeing as a roof will cost about \$31,000 and knowing there is no way Good Shepherd can afford this, please pray for the committee as they explore ways to "think outside the box" for additional funds.

On September 18th, Resurrection will be celebrating their 44th year as a parish. They have invited anyone from Good Shepherd to come celebrate with them. Sue Hertless and Betty Jacobsen plan to go. Let Sue know if you would like to join them.

By the way Christian Ayala our contact in El Salvador, is a famous artist. Pastor Jeremy has some of his artwork on the wall in his office. You might want to stop by and see it. During the civil war in El Salvador,

Christian was targeted by death squads. His mother arranged a hasty exit to Sweden where he lived for 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  years. We will be writing more about this in the July issue of Shepherd's Voice.


Introducing New Members Tyler and Kristina Costa!



The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President, Greg Buchholz.

Invocation and Devotions: Council President Greg Buchholz led us in prayer.

**Recognitions:** Sue Hertless recommended that we recognize Linda Rodemsky for writing articles on our new members for Shepherd's Voice. Nils Anderson thanked Adam Castle, Karin Olson and Greg Buchholz for doing the 2015 audit in his Finance Report.

Worship and Music Committee: Leone McCullough reported that on June 12 we will begin our summer schedule with one service at 9:30 a.m. We will have pulpit supply on June 5 when Pastor Jeremy is at the Synod Assembly.

**Long Range Planning and Property:** Tony Rogelstad reported that the suggestion of using a pew from Fellowship Hall was not a feasible solution to prevent tripping in the bell choir area, as the pews are too long and the problem with bolting down for stability. Tape will be put on the steps in the choir area. A leak in the irrigation system and rain gutter replacement must be addressed. Doors should be checked for door closers; this is important for fire safety requirements. Tony reported that they plan to overlay the deck at Luther Hall with plywood instead of doing a ramp.

**Evangelism Committee:** Sue Hertless reported that the Craft Fair to support our sister parish in El Salvador has been moved to July. Sue also reported that Ione Bantly will be heading up the "Laying on of Hands" Ministry and Kristina Costa will have "thinking of you" cards for shut-ins, for members to sign on the third Sunday of each month.

**Social Ministry Committee:** Candace Bradley reported that Friends Feeding Friends is still providing food bags for congregational members to distribute to those in need. Bags of dog food are also available. Also, FFF appreciates everyone who volunteers to help in this important ministry at Good Shepherd.
