Rev's Reflections

"For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in rememberance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." (I Corinthians II:23-26)

Sometimes we get so used to coming to the liturgy every Sunday that we don't think to examine it. As regular participants it's easy for us to forget that everything we do in the liturgy is based on scripture. When we sing hymns, share the peace of Christ, have our sins forgiven, hear the sermon, break the bread, lift the cup, along with everything else we do, it is an action that has been passed on to us from our ancestors in the faith.

One of the central actions we receive in the liturgy is the Eucharist. Lutherans don't often use the word Eucharist to describe the meal Jesus instituted: it's a word that is seen as "too Roman Catholic." But this word comes from scripture. The Greek word comes from Eucharistia which is translated above as "he had given thanks." Eucharisteo comes from the words eu and charis meaning "Good Gift." And this is exactly what we are given every week—a good gift.

Holy Communion, the Eucharist, the Table, whatever you call it, is a gift from God to us. As Luther says, "It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself." The benefit of God's good gift "is shown us in these words: Given, and shed for you, for the remission of sins; namely, that in the Sacrament, forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation." I can't think of a *gooder* gift. In this meal we are united to our Lord and given forgiveness of sins and salvation.

There all kinds of ways churches practice this meal. The common cup is the oldest tradition. Intinction and individual glasses are recent innovations. But, those are by no means the only methods. There have been times in church history where people brought their own straws and spoons to drink from the chalice.

This summer during our one service we will be moving our practice to intinction as our method of participating in the Eucharist. You will receive the body of our Lord in your palm and then intinct (dip it) into the chalice. If you are unable to do this then know that the whole of Christ is promised and given in a single element alone. We are going to do this for the summer and may return to the individual glasses in the fall. If you have any questions or comments about this move to intinction please see me. I look forward to seeing you Sunday.

May 2015 - Council Meeting Notes

Meeting Called to order at 7:09 pm by vice president Leone McCullough.

Devotions were given by Jon Moss.

Present: Pr. Jeremy Serrano, Leone McCullough, Tony Rogelstad, Nils Anderson, and Donna Albrecht.

Absent: Herb Yonge, Vicki Smiglewski, Laura Mott, Emilie Patton, and Greg Buchholz.

Recognitions: Jon Moss recognized Jamie Rodemsky for replacing the lights on the flagpole. Long Range Planning and Property committee recognized Rod Uffindell for his work on the church's security system.

Pastor reported he came back from the Homiletics seminar rejuvenated and refreshed. Pastor Jeremy reviewed the summer schedule. He also reported he would like to plan for single joint services on festival Sundays including Palm Sunday, Easter, Ascension Sunday, and Pentecost. Some concerns had been raised about the quality of the cleaning job done in the kitchen and fellowship hall after a recent event. Pastor assured the council that the issue has been handled.

Child Safety Policy: It was discussed that parts of our Child Safety policy are not being adhered to currently; specifically the qualifications of the Sunday School teacher. The discussion was tabled until we have a larger turn-out.

Action Item: Herb will investigate whether some requirements of the Child Safety Policy can be relaxed. Specifically, Council wants to know if the rules on the Sunday School teachers and assistants needing to be members of our congregation are necessary.

Action Item: Finance Committee will contact our insurance agent to determine whether we are covered for liability purposes for people who are members who use the facilities for private events, whether they pay or use the space gratis; and whether it makes any difference in our insurance whether nonmembers using the facilities pay or receive the use gratis.

Property Committee: Jon moved that the immediate storage needs for Friends Feeding Friends and ways to fill those needs be explored. Nils seconded the motion. Msc.

Jon opened a discussion about having his mother, Leida Moss, a Marriage, Family, and Child Counselor rent space two mid-week days in the Fireside Room. He will discuss our concerns with her and get back to the council next month.


