A Message from Interim Pastor Lori

We nearly filled the Fireside room – 16 people with eyes closed and hearts open, breathing deeply and just *being* in the presence of God. Everyone had chosen a meditation word from a basket, and contemplated how that word connected with the image of the door to our hearts. Because many were new to meditation, we sat for only a few minutes after the discussion time, with a CD of monks chanting quietly in Latin helping form a sacred space. I had wondered if even those few minutes would be too long for the group, since many of us are so accustomed to always *doing*.

But some participants told me later, "I was disappointed when it was time to stop; I didn't want it to end."

Sitting in silence is an act of worship; we expect no ecstatic experience or voice from heaven, we simply come humbly before our Creator. But sitting in silence is also a gift – time to stop running the daily treadmill and just *be* in the presence of Divine Love, breathing that love in deeply and knowing that God will give us whatever God knows we need in that moment.

In March we continue our Lent journey, ending the month with Holy Week and anticipating the dawn of Easter (March 31). So this month we continue to make time to consider our baptismal call.

Baptized into Christ's life, death and resurrection, we are called to recognize and turn from the forces of evil that work overtime trying to keep us from being who we were created to be. It's not easy, during Lent or any time, to look inside and see the dark places in our own hearts. As a faith community, can we admit the ways in which we hurt one another with gossip, anger, jealousy, pride, despair or indifference, or with the endless ways we give in to temptation at every turn?

Jesus, too, struggled with temptation those 40 days in the wilderness, and knows our struggle; and Jesus forgave even the darkest hearts, even from the cross.

Do we understand that Jesus walks with GSLC on this Lent journey? Do we realize that Jesus weeps for us, as he did for Jerusalem (*Luke 13:31-35*), when we fail to love one another? Do we trust that the repentance Christ calls us to frees us?

You are invited as we continue the Midweek Lent meditation on Wednesday nights at 7 p.m., following the 6:30 p.m. soup supper. Even if you are not reading the daily reflections from Joyce Rupp's "Open the Door," come and spend time in silent meditation, worshiping and resting in Divine Love, and asking God to open the door of your heart to the life you are meant to live together.




Soup Suppers and Lenten Study



A Message from our Council President

At the Annual Meeting in January it was suggested the Council share more information. Here is my attempt to do just that.

We are currently having Soup Supper every Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. with Meditation Time following. Come and spend time in fellowship during Lent with a simple meal and a half hour or so of quiet time opening the door of your heart to listen to God through meditation.

Palm Sunday is March 24, and we will have 2 services. Easter is March 31, and we will have one (1) service starting at 9:30 a.m. and a brunch immediately following the service, along with an Easter Egg Hunt. We will be providing more information as the time gets closer. Especially, how you can volunteer to help with decorating the Sanctuary, preparing the brunch, or organizing the Easter Egg Hunt.

At the last Council Meeting there were four intentional interim tasks identified by Pastor Lori. Council Members were asked to sign up and work with the congregation and Pastor Lori. The Council Members will be looking for congregation members input and to be on the task force, if possible.

The Boy Scouts of America District Executive has asked if one of the Concord Troops could use our space on Thursday nights, twice a month. The council approved, and starting in April you will see Boy Scouts and their parents using the upstairs rooms for scouting. They will be doing service projects in lieu of paying rent. We are pleased with this partnership and hope over time it will develop into a Boy Scout and Good Shepherd Charter. We will keep everyone posted.

Kings Valley Christian School has asked if the Good Shepherd parking lot could be a staging area if there were a situation where the parents needed to pick up the children and the school was not available or a safe place for that to happen. The council agreed we wanted to make our space available and asked Herb if he would work with the principal to ensure both parties understood the plan, requirements, and the responsibilities for the school and our church. Effective immediately the plan is in place for the Good Shepherd parking lot to be a staging area for Kings Valley Christian School should an emergency arise requiring parents to pick up their children when the school premises are not available due to an emergency.

Sprint Nextel has notified Good Shepherd of termination of their Cell Tower contract. The details are being worked out between Long Range Planning and Property. Last year the contract brought in \$27,000 and represents 9% of the budget. The Finance Committee will be working to see how this will affect the 2013 budget. We will have a lot more to say about this issue as more information is obtained.

I hope you have found this information to be informative and helpful to satisfy your desire for the Council to communicate with our congregation.

Thrivent Contra Costa Chapter

Some of you may be aware that I am the President of the Contra Costa Chapter of Thrivent Financials for Lutherans for 2013. Betty Jacobsen is the Director of Records. Rowena Henry from Saint John's in Antioch is the Advocate Director. It is wonderful having Rowena on the board with her organizational skills and ability to foster and support teamwork.

Two of the five board members are from Good Shepherd. Betty and I believe Thrivent is a strong financial institution and are proud to be members of Thrivent as well as work with other Lutheran Churches in the Chapter to do God's Work with Our Hands.

Each chapter who meets the necessary criteria is given money yearly to do community work. For two years our chapter has been given \$23K. Good Shepherd last year requested and received \$2,600. We used \$1,000 for Winter Nights, \$1,000 for Giving Thanks at Thanksgiving, \$100 for the Meet Up Group who knitted and crocheted hats, and scarves for the homeless, and \$500 to Friends Feeding Friends. How many of you knew Thrivent was supporting Good Shepherd with these ministries?

Thrivent also has another program call "Choice Dollars" where members who qualify with either an \$800 insurance policy and/or \$20,000 contract can designate a 501C3 organization or church to receive Thrivent Dollars. This is a nice way to support an organization or church. There has been a change in policy this year as you must state your intentions for the "choice dollars" identified from your portfolio. It is easy to do. Either go on the website Thrivent.com or call Thrivent at 800-847-4836. It only takes less than 5 minutes.

Lastly, the Contra Costa Chapter has 3 bold goals this year:

Make people aware of Choice Dollars Lots of participation at the A's Game Fundraiser Thrivent / Habitat Build in Pittsburg

Our Chapter is doing a remodel in Pittsburg and must raise \$12,200 and must contribute 870 volunteer hours. You will hear much more about this as we get into full swing in March. So think about how you could help. Can you volunteer to work on building the house? Perhaps you could prepare the lunches for the volunteers and take to the site, or holding a fundraiser and donating the money to the Thrivent / Habitat Build in Pittsburg. I am sure that you will think of many other ways. We will need a lot of help to raise the money.

Thrivent each year identifies a charity to receive the money from the A's Baseball Game fundraiser. Again, this year we will pick a game we think will draw a lot of people, sell the tickets, do a tailgate lunch, give each person snacks and drinks to take inside the game, and all the money raised will go to Thrivent / Habitat Build 2013. The tickets for the game are purchased and donated to the chapter. Watch for more to come about the A's Game and our Thrivent / Habitat Build.

This year is starting off with many exciting and eventful approaches for helping others and fellowship within our Lutheran family. Join us, we are a fun group.

FFF had another amazing month. Soon, we will be able to purchase food at a low cost from the food bank. We are excited because it means we will be able feed more friends!! One of the things we have discovered is that our needy friends need some ongoing help with food and basic necessities long after we furnish them. Some continue to barely make ends meet. We feel if we continue to provide occasional support, they will stay housed and not end up homeless again. We also served 125 meals at the shelter with help from Awakenings Church, New Life Church, Tabernacle, Valley Christian and the Lady Hawk softball team, a meal of hot dogs, chili, broccoli salad, hard boiled eggs, bananas, cake and cookies. We would also like to thank Tabernacle School for their "Expression of Love" Valentine gift bags. The students collected soap, socks, toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, brushes, combs and ponytail bands, tissue and Valentine candy, and packed an amazing 179 gift bags, wow! FFF also furnished a young vet, a single woman, a single dad, and a disabled senior, and picked up donations of furniture. Our linen pile is huge and we need help laundering, organizing and labeling. If you can help, please contact us. And, if you have new donations of linens, we would so appreciate if you can launder them and label the size of the sheets before you donate them. We don't have a washer and dryer at our church. We are in need of brown paper or reusable grocery bags if you can spare a few.

The next time we will meet for our hot lunch will be Saturday, March 16, 2013. We will serve ham and au gratin potatoes, broccoli salad, green salad and fruit. If you would like to help sort donations, pack hygiene kits and "food for later" bags, meet us at Good Shepherd at 9:30 AM. If you want to help prepare the lunch, please contact Dana the week of March 16. If you would like to help serve lunch and pass out donations, meet us at the shelter at noon. If you want to volunteer but can't make it to our lunch, contact us for other volunteer opportunities. We can always use help!

If you can help with groceries and basic necessities, our needy friends need: fresh fruit and vegetables of any kind • groceries of any kind • dishes • small appliances • laundry soap • lamps • towels • pots and pans • toasters • toilet paper • eating utensils • cleaning items • dish soap • cooking utensils • travel size hygiene items • microwave ovens • dressers and end tables • can openers • small sauce pans • bar soap
