#### A Message from our Interim Pastor

We say that we believe in resurrection...

The core of Christian faith is that Jesus died and rose again for the love and salvation of humankind. But like the first disciples – whose struggles to live out their calling we hear about in the Sundays after Easter – we, too, struggle to comprehend and live out the unexpected, unearned, unending grace of God in Christ.

Who is this Resurrected One?

Early in May, our Scripture readings present Christ as the Good Shepherd and the bringer of peace. Jesus is a shepherd willing to give up his own life for his beloved flock; and we abide securely in this one, who is the very source of life, whom death can't contain. Christ is life, love, peace and purpose – and in our baptisms, the Spirit of the Living Christ is alive in us.

So what does resurrection *mean* for followers of the Risen One? "Just as I have loved you, so also you should love one another," Jesus says in John 13:34. The self-giving love of Christ is not what the world expects. Power is made perfect not in domination and revenge, but in mercy and forgiveness. How do you love *like Christ*? How have you experienced resurrection, and how have others experienced resurrection in you?

And what does resurrection mean for this congregation?
On May 19 we celebrate Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit, though whom and in whom the people of God are created and re-created. Re-creation, re-birth, renewal, resurrection – these are hope-filled words for Good Shepherd, a congregation in transition that is looking to the future. As you will read in the Interim Ministry Update, the Call Committee will have been elected by the time you read this. Can you feel that the Holy Spirit is alive and moving at Good Shepherd? Do you know that resurrection – whatever that may look like – is your destiny? Imagine what Good Shepherd will look like a year from now: Who will be your pastor? What new people will walk through the doors? What ministries will flourish?

Imagine that future – and imagine it as though you *truly believe* in resurrection!

#### UPDATE ON THE CELL TOWER AND HOW IT EFFECTS OUR BUDGET

At the April 9<sup>th</sup> Council meeting, the effect of the potential loss of the Nextel Cell Tower, which is the fake tree in the upper parking lot, was discussed and it was agreed we will continue to do business as usual until the tower is removed and the monthly rental is terminated.

The contract states rent is due until the removal of the tower takes place and as of this date it is still in place.

Had the tower been removed on or about April I the loss of income would have been \$17, 236. A proposed revised Budget was prepared by the Finance Committee with the recommendation that we should continue with payments of discretionary funds until rent is discontinued. The discretionary accounts are: Outreach Ministries, Youth and Capital Improvements and Maintenance. If and when the loss of rental income is realized, the Finance Committee will prepare a recommended Revised Budget and it will be presented to the Congregation for approval.

# The Call Process: Responsibilities of Call Committee, Congregation and Council

#### Three Phases to the Call Committee's (CC) Work:

- **Visioning** The CC works with the interim pastor and council on a process that allows the entire congregation to share in visioning. Results reported to all.
- Writing the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) The CC writes the MSP based on the outcome of the visioning process. The CC keeps the council and congregation informed on progress, and the congregation offers input on finished MSP.
- Interviewing/recommending a candidate for call The CC interviews candidates and makes the recommendation. The council prepares the salary/benefits package. The congregation meets the candidate on a Sunday morning and votes on the candidate.

#### Time Commitment:

There are times when the CC will be meeting weekly (such as when writing the MSP) or on weekends (interviewing the candidates). During down-time (perhaps while waiting for candidate names from the synod) the CC can work on interview techniques, a mock interview, etc. The schedule and meeting times are decided on by the CC members.

#### How Information is Shared:

Transparency in the process is vital; confidentiality concerning candidates is, too.

The CC will update the council and congregation regularly as to their **process** and **progress**; that's the transparency part. Candidates' names and other info are **not** shared outside of the CC; that's the confidential part.

#### CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TO ELECT A CALL COMMITTEE

#### Interim Ministry Update, May 2013

Congratulations on electing your Call Committee (see pg. 5). This means we are entering a new phase of interim ministry. The Call Committee's first task is to work with the interim pastor and the council in leading the congregation in some short-term visioning. Then they will be ready to fill out the I4-page Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which is like a resume for the congregation.

Once the MSP is completed, the congregation will get a chance to look at it and give feedback as to whether it accurately reflects Good Shepherd and your vision and mission. Then the MSP will be sent to the synod, and candidates' names will be forwarded to the Call Committee based on the MSP. The Call Committee will interview the candidates and make a recommendation for call. The Council will put together the salary and benefits package, and the congregation will vote on the candidate after a "meet-and-greet" with the candidate and, if possible, his or her family.

What is YOUR role in all this? Show up and participate. Be part of looking forward with hope. Remember that the success of your ministry with your new pastor will depend not just on the pastor, but on each participant of this faith community. And, most of all, pray – pray for the Call Committee, GSLC, and the pastor you will call. The Spirit has someone in mind for Good Shepherd, and may God bless the process that will bring that person and this congregation together.
