## *Interim pastor's November message,*

So here we are at the start of a time of interim ministry at Good Shepherd – and some of you may be thinking, “Again? Didn’t we just do this?!”

Maybe others are thinking, “Why are we doing this? We should just call a new pastor as soon as we can.”

And still others are thinking. “This time, let’s really try to figure out what’s going on here!”

As your new interim pastor, I am excited about that third statement – about discovering with you what this particular community of faith is all about. What are the ways in which you are energized about being conduits of God’s grace in Concord and the surrounding region? What issues or dynamics may be impairing your witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ?

But I also have a sense of where the first two sentiments above may be coming from. In my first month here, I have heard some of the pain many of you have experienced in the upheaval surrounding your former pastor leaving. Some of you have shared with me your confusion, frustration, hurt and anger over the tenure of various former pastors. In the search for answers, blame begins to arise: It’s the pastor’s fault. It’s the synod’s fault. It’s the fault of this group or that person in the congregation.

In the midst of all this, let’s make a point to remind each other that the Spirit is at work at Good Shepherd. Let’s assume that participants in this congregation, pastors in general, and synod staff are all people who are – however imperfectly! – trying to be disciples of Christ. Let’s trust that God has something in mind for us, as the church on earth – and that we’ve come together at such a time as this to serve God’s purposes.

And let’s understand this: **Everyone** in any group of human beings has an impact on that group. **Everyone**. The group could be a family, a class, a book club, a sports team, an office team, a volunteer organization, strangers on a bus, a presidential cabinet or a congregation. It is vital that we understand that each person who enters, exists in, or leaves a group impacts the group as a whole. That means that each one of us plays a role in the health and vitality of Good Shepherd – which isn’t surprising, since we already know we are all part of the body of Christ.

Note that this month we celebrate **All Saints Sunday** (Nov. 4), **Commitment Sunday** (Nov. 18), **Thanksgiving** (joint **Thanksgiving Eve** service with St. Mark's and St. Luke's on Nov. 21 at 7 p.m.) and **Christ the King** (Nov. 25). What is all of this all about? Even as a congregation in transition, you are remembering saints and committing to stewardship and giving thanks. And then the church year culminates with ... celebrating Christ's reign! *That's* what it's all about! Christ lives and rules our hearts, and Christ calls us to make God's grace visible in this world. The church exists to be the hands and heart of Christ to our neighbors and to one another. Let's be about *that*, always. Then the rest will fall into place.

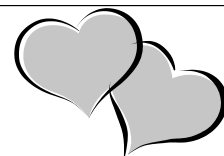
**November:** Please bring in new **socks, mittens** and/or beanies to the box in the Narthex or office. We will also still be collecting that leftover candy.

## REQUEST FROM YOUR FINANCE COMMITTEE

Recently we have heard from several members giving Temple Talks during our Stewardship Campaign requesting we try to make a pledge rather than going the "unpledged" route. Making a pledge helps the Finance Committee and the Council to better allocate/budget resources. Making a pledge is not "cast in concrete." If you need to adjust your pledge that can be accomplished by just letting our Financial Secretary know.

This year, 2012, our Unpledged was budgeted for \$39,000 and as of September 30<sup>th</sup> have received \$38,029 almost reaching the annual budget in just 9 months.

Some of us may not have pledged for 2012 as we did not know the direction we were going. We have a good sense of our direction with Pastor Lori joining us as Intentional Interim and with the objective of having a call pastor by the fall of next year.

### **GIVING THANKS AT THANKSGIVING**

**Eight years ago Good Shepherd's Pastor Eric Strom and Council Members Susan Metzger and Sue Hertless presented to First Lutheran's Pastor Jim Muller and their Council the vision of providing a Thanksgiving Dinner for people in the community who needed a hot meal and/or to people who didn't want to be alone on this holiday. After much discussion, the plans began to come to life with meetings, request for volunteers, assigned task, and some guiding principles for the event. Some principles were:**

**The table must look as if you were coming to my house for a Thanksgiving meal.**

**That means, linen tablecloth, real plates, silverware, glasses, table decoration and a traditional meal with all the trimmings.**

**There is no cost. It is free.**

**And, you can see God's love for each person through us.**

**We have been blessed every year since 2006 with more volunteers than we need. What a wonderful problem to have. We quit advertising for volunteers because people were so disappointed when they were told all the positions are filled. People wanted to volunteer their time, and give of themselves to help others. We began to collect socks, blankets, coats, and sleeping bags and allowed any who needed these items the opportunity after their meal to receive these gifts. Just another way of giving thanks at Thanksgiving.**

**We even assigned table host/hostesses to each table to help people with getting to know one another. Create a natural conversation, not in a forceful or contrived way but a loving way. This is an area that is delicate, and needs to be handled with utmost love and tenderness as we interact with each other.**

**Why did we go to First Lutheran Church to hold this event? Good question! We did not have a commercial kitchen at Good Shepherd and we knew our sister and brothers at First Lutheran did. We also had built some relationships with First Lutheran and knew their goals and our goals were aligned for they had the same concerns about the community and what a great way to create a ministry where we are serving the community - TOGETHER. Over the years, we branched out and offered other churches the opportunity to participate with us in this ministry. They are: Saint Matthews, and CrossRoads.**

**Thrivent Financials has been beside us all the way every year for eight years, offering financial support in food, clothing, and utensils. Can you name any other financial institution that gives back to the community like Thrivent does? Yes, there is paperwork that has to be filled out. However, we understand they must show the government when asked how the money was used. So we fill out the paperwork with a smile because we know how Thanksgiving Day is going to be for those people who come.**
