Thank you to Larry Huddleston for his ongoing work on the telephone system.

As reported last month we had several recent break-ins to Fellowship Hall. At our August Council meeting Jon Moss presented a bid for installing motion detectors and other devices for securing our campus. We will be getting another bid and we should be making a decision soon as to better protecting our facilities. We are also addressing all exterior lighting. Also, we had a car break in on Sunday August 17 during services. We will be having folks walk the campus during services in hopes this does not happen again.

On Saturday afternoon on August 23 the sanctuary was found unlock. Our Altar Guild folks have stated they did lock the doors. Who is going in other than Altar Guild on a Saturday afternoon? Any ideas? Any suggestions other than we will arm the sanctuary shortly?

On Sunday, August 17, I advised those present that we are losing one of our cell tower lessees, T Mobile. The loss of this revenue represents approximately 13% of our total income. Our Long Range Planning Committee is contacting potential communication companies as well as the City of Concord. Our Finance Committee will be taking this into consideration in developing our 2015 Budget.

Our Stewardship Committee is working hard in preparing the information packets to be delivered in October. You will be hearing more about this year's campaign in the next month or two.

I had the opportunity to visit with Dana Deniston to discuss Friends Feeding Friends storage needs. I am truly amazed by the dedication of our members and friends who participate in this worthwhile ministry. Thanks to all of those associated with this ministry with time and financial support.

The committee to write the policy for a maintaining a Safe Environment presented their draft to the Council on August 12. The policy is entitled Youth/Child Protection Policy. Council members are reviewing the policy with the intent of approving the policy at the September meeting. The committee, Joe Carlson, Emilie Patton and Kristi Buchholz are to be thanked for their excellent work.

Our committee reviewing our Constitution continues their work. The committee is Greg Buchholz, Laura Mott and Donna Albrecht.

Joe Carlson and the other members of the Safe Environment committee asked Council to come up with procedures for fire safety and the possible use of a defibrillator. He handed out a document, "Youth/Child Protection Policy" and asked Council members to study it and give feedback at our September meeting. Any suggested changes can be sent to Laura. Nils suggested that Good Shepherd maintain a sign-in/sign-out log for events.

Nils moved to change the regular Council meeting from September 9 to September 2 at 7:00 pm in order to accommodate President Yonge's schedule. Msc.

President Yonge announced the Nominating Committee will be named in September.

September 15 is the due date for committees making budget requests. The finance committee will present a Proposed Budget on October 12. Pledge packets for members will be distributed on November 8.

The Call Committee has a new list of possible pastoral candidates and is starting the interview process.

Nils announced that revenue from the Tower is going down because one carrier is leaving, reducing out revenue from the tower by \$40,000 per year.

There is a search underway for a new Choir director.

Companies that provide security services are being interviewed about our campus needs.

Property committee announced that our property has dead trees abutting an adjoining property that need to be removed.

Mark reported for the Stewardship Committee discussed the upcoming Temple Talks and asked for volunteers.


