A Message from Interim Pastor Lori Eickmann January 2014

When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" (Mt. 1:38a)

What *are* we looking for? Clarity? Security? The discipline to keep our New Year's resolutions? What is this congregation looking for? A new pastor, certainly. And stability? The strength and people to carry out a vision for mission?

What does it look like to, first and foremost, seek ... Jesus?

They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" (Mt. 1:38b)

Where does Jesus *dwell*? Are we willing to go there – to where we see, hear and experience Jesus? And what happens when we *do* encounter Christ – and when others encounter Christ in us?

Jesus said to them, "Come and see." (Mt. 1:39)

Come and see. Three words of such promise and hope. What a gift it is to begin a new calendar year with gospel texts that reveal – in stages, like the pale dawn light growing to bright fullness by morning – first the identity of the child in the manger and then the dawning truth of what that identity means for the world.

First comes Epiphany, which we will observe on Jan. 5, when we see in the journey of the Magi a vision of all nations seeking and receiving the gift of Love revealed in an infant. Then in his baptism in the Jordan River, Jesus is claimed and named by God as God's own son. And after that, Jesus' mission and ministry begin with the call of the first disciples.

We have been called, too. We have been called to come and see what God has done for us and this world in Christ. So we look from the manger to the cross to the empty tomb, and we see the heart of God – the heart of our vulnerable, loving, forgiving, suffering, resurrecting, liberating, living God!

This new year is full of promise. We will inevitably part ways sometime in the months ahead when you call your new pastor, but may we all live this year grounded in hope that the Holy Spirit of the living Christ is calling us not simply into the future we desire in the limitations of our imaginations, but into the future *God* imagines *for us* in limitless grace.

> Jesus beckons: "Come and see." Let's do it! And a blessed New Year to all!

Interim Ministry Update - January 2014

With the Ministry Site Profile submitted to the synod, Good Shepherd has entered the final phase of this time of interim ministry: getting candidate names, interviewing, and calling your new pastor.

This congregation and your call committee and council have worked hard this past year, and it is paying off. Have you noticed the increased energy, the new leaders stepping up, and the joy that accompanied the recent dinners and projects such as Care Bears? Bless you for your dedication to learning, loving and serving in Christ's name. Well done!

So many of you were involved in the first two phases of interim ministry: 1) the initial interviews and discussion about what needed immediate attention at GSLC, and the changes to worship, education and the call process that came about as a result, and 2) the summer visioning sessions, creation of the MSP by the call committee, and the recent review of the MSP by the membership. Again, well done.

The call committee did a good job describing the strengths and challenges at GSLC in the profile. The essay they wrote at the end of the MSP is poignant in its expression of the hurt that remains from issues dating back several years (such as the choir's disagreement with a former pastor, and some lay leaders' experience of the last pastor) and the lack of closure for some over such experiences.

A process presented at the mediation class I attended in November may be helpful in allowing this community to create that closure, so I urge GSLC to consider engaging such a process. Also helpful: your council already has voted to engage the Healthy Start program when your new pastor arrives. Healthy Start is a Saturday retreat (with four brief follow-up sessions over the following I2 months) that aims to get a new pastor, lay leaders and staff on the same page from the beginning.

Please continue to thank your call committee – Nils, Candace, Greg, John and Aimee – for the work they've done so far and will continue to do as they begin interviewing candidates. Please continue to pray for them. Enjoy wondering together: What does God have in mind for Good Shepherd and this new pastor who is out there, somewhere? What ministries will flow from this new partnership? Trust that Christ is walking with you on this continuing journey!
