Rev's Reflections

So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! (2 Corinthians 5.17, NRSV)

Does anyone else really enjoy walking around office supply, hardware, and container stores? There's something about having before me all of the supplies I would need to create, build, and become organized that gets me excited. There's just so much potential waiting to be found in those aisles; I can often lose track of time or forget the one thing I came in for while meandering around the store. As a part of the New Year celebration, the whole world seems to be charged with the same feeling of potential. In the new year, there is fresh hope, new possibilities, and another chance. Forget that I've completed exactly zero of my 2014 New Year's Resolutions; 2015 is going to be a new start. Does anyone else have these same thoughts?

Starting all over again can be a wonderful thing. In our faith life we start over again whenever we come before our Gracious God with hearts full of repentance and ask for forgiveness. In scripture and liturgy, we read, "If we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive all our sins and cleanse us from unrighteousness." We are cleansed of ALL our sins when we confess. If we are truly cleansed, then we can truly start over again. There is hope and another chance with a fresh start.






RUTH CIRCLE BIBLE STUDY

A Message from our Council President

I cannot believe I am writing an article for January. Where has the year gone? (I am writing this note before our Christmas Eve services but I am sure they will/went off just fine.)

Last year was a special year for us. We called Jeremy Serrano to be our pastor in October and things started off with a bang! "The Rev" announced we will begin Sunday School on January 11, and our Youth will gather on the last Wednesday of the month. Things are happening.

On December 13, Jeremy was ordained at his home church in San Diego. Nils Anderson attended the service. Thanks Nils for representing Good Shepherd. On January 4th Jeremy will be installed as our pastor here at Good Shepherd. One service at 11am.

The Budget for 2015 was presented by the Finance Committee to the Council at the December Council meeting. The committee developed a balanced budget taking into consideration the loss of income from one of the cell towers. To balance the budget, discretionary funds such as several Outreach programs had to be eliminated, as well as the funding of the Capital Improvements Maintenance Reserve.

In order to restore the Outreach Programs we need to have additional income. Currently, Pledges and Unpledged are projected at \$163,462 or 67% of our income. We are projected to receive \$79,153 from the towers and other rental income sources.

Of course the 2015 Budget has to be approved by the Congregation at the Annual Meeting on January 25th 2015.

Our Nominating Committee submitted their recommendations to the Council. The members to be considered by the Congregation at the Annual Meeting are: Vicki Smiglewski, Laura Mott and Tony Rogelstad. We would like one more member for Council. Nominations can be made during the meeting as long as the nominated member has given their approval to be nominated.

Our thanks to the Property Committee for their successful effort to renew one of the cell site leases for another year. Without this lease we would have had to make some drastic cuts.


We are now earning money on our assets by moving funds from Bank of America General Checking where no interest was paid to an investment account with Vanguard where our dollars will grow.

December 2014 - Council Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. on December 9, 2014, by President Herb Yonge.

Devotions were given by Herb.

Council members present: Pr. Jeremy, Drew Cremisio, Greg Buchholz, Nils Anderson, Donna Albrecht, Vicki Smiglewski, Herb Yonge, Emilie Patton, and Leone McCullough.

Council member absent: Mark Deniston

Guest: Laura Mott.

Recognitions: Herb thanked all the people who came the previous Saturday and decorated the Sanctuary for Christmas and decorated the tree in Fellowship Hall. Emilie was thanked for filling in as Choir Director while the position was open. She was also thanked for spearheading the Thanksgiving Dinner celebration in Fellowship Hall. Herb also thanked all who helped in preparing, serving, and cleaning up after the event. Larry Huddleston was thanked for moving the phone in Pastor's office to a better place.

Nils moved to accept the November Minutes as written. It was seconded by Greg. Msc.

The Pastor recommended that Good Shepherd consider a new logo for our congregation. Drew moved we designate \$200 from the "Other Professional Funds" account and have some preliminary designs created. Vicki seconded. Msc.

Pastor Jeremy expressed eagerness to begin the "Healthy Start" program for pastors new in their call. Council decided to have the initial full-day meeting on February 7, 2015 at St. Matthew's.

Pastor mentioned that member(s) had requested that Council authorize the purchase of chairs that have armrests to go with the standard chairs in Fellowship Hall. The idea will be considered by Council members and discussed more fully in January 2015.

Bob and Sue Ripley have stated that they plan to begin having the Leisure Lunch program twice a month rather than the once a month schedule now.

Pr. Jeremy suggested we think about asking the congregation to donate toward Christmas gifts for Lay Staff. The discussion concluded there wasn't enough time left to get the hoped-for response. Instead, Donna moved that year-end bonuses be given out of church funds to employees Vicki seconded the motion. It passed with one no vote.

Laura noted that the Committee reports for the Annual report are due in the office no later than January 15 for the Annual Meeting on January 25.

The residents of Pioneer House will be moving out by the end of February so Pr. Jeremy and his family can move in. Then renters have lived there since July 2011 and have been good tenants. They were given a 120 day notice. After a discussion, Emilie moved that we help them by forgoing the February rent and immediately refund their \$1,700 deposit when they move out leaving the property in good order. Greg seconded the motion. Msc.

Finance committee member Nils recommended that funds in excess of \$50,000 in Good Shepherd's General Account at the Bank of America be transferred to the Vanguard Investment Account. Greg seconded. Msc.

The high charges on our Property Tax bill discussed last month were negotiated down to half of their previous level.

Emilie moved to accept the Budget for the Church for 2015 prepared by the Finance Committee. Vicki seconded the motion. It passed with one abstention.

Worship and Music Committee member Leone thanked Marcia and Larry Sander, Herb Yonge, Tony and Cindy Rogelstad, Linda Mahloch, and Joe and Laura Carlson for decorating the Sanctuary Christmas trees. She noted that we now have a new choir director, Ondine Young, who was installed last Sunday. Pastor Jeremy will be installed at Good Shepherd on January 4 at a single service held at 11 am with a luncheon to follow.


The Long Range & Property Committee announced that they have signed a new contract with Sprint.

Sunday School will begin on January 11 between services. There will be classes for adults and children.

The Social Ministry committee was recognized for managing the Care Bear program for Thanksgiving and for their support of the Thanksgiving Dinner.

The committee charged with reviewing our church constitution is making progress. They plan to meet with Pastor Jeremy before the January Council meeting.
