Rev's Reflections

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand." (John 10:27-28)

Jesus tells us that if we are his sheep, we will hear his voice. In our ever increasing secular society it has become taboo to talk like we hear from God. But, we as Lutherans believe that God has never stopped speaking to God's people. But, hearing from God takes work. We are so inundated with white noise from social media, entertainment, phones, television, music, that we often miss God speaking.

The Prophet Elijah was to meet God on Mount Horeb, and here is how the encounter happened.

"He said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by.' Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; 12 and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. 13 When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?'" (1 King 19:11-13) It wasn't until there was silence that Elijah could hear from God.

During this Lenten season try some silence. Take 5 minutes a day to be by yourself. I put in ear plugs, and go into our sanctuary, which you are welcome to do, too. Do whatever it takes to get silent. Hearing from God takes some preparation, but hopefully this practice will prepare you to hear God when it gets noisy around you.

To refine our God listening ears, during our Lenten Evening prayers, we will be doing an exercise called Lectio Divina (Latin for "Divine Reading"). This is a traditional practice of scriptural reading, meditation, and prayer intended to cultivate communion with God and to increase the participants knowledge of God's Word.

I will read a passage of scripture several times, in between each reading there will be a period of silence. I will have the participants focus on a particular aspect of the verse.

Through this exercise and your silence, it is my hope that we begin to hear from God together in order that we might love God more and our neighbor.

Join us Wednesdays at 6:30 pm for soup and 7:00 pm for prayer.



The Luther Rose

In El Salvador the Luther Rose was seen on the paraments at Resurrection Lutheran Church and on the wooden cross necklace given to Betty Jacobsen by one of the Lutheran pastors there. The Evangelism Committee is using the same Luther Rose on some of the paraments being made for "Noisy Offering Sundays."

Martin Luther personally oversaw the creation of the Luther Rose and thought of it as a symbol of his theology. It is also known as the Luther Seal. Following are some explanations of its meaning.

The BLACK cross placed in the center of the heart symbolizes that Jesus' agonizing death on the cross out of love for us. Just as the cross is centered in the heart; Jesus' love, life, and death should be the center of our faith.

The heart represents the passion of God's love for us. It's a pure natural RED to remind us that Christ shed his blood for us and that our sins are forgiven. God's love for us is untarnished by our sinful nature and He loves us unconditionally.

The Rose is WHITE symbolizing the reverence and purity of the Holy Spirit that brings us to faith so we can have peace, joy and comfort in our lives. White is the color for angels and blessed spirits in the Bible. For example: we observe white surrounding Jesus in the Transfiguration story (Matthew 17:1-8), in the angel outside Jesus' tomb, that indicated "He is not here, He has risen." (Matthew 28:6) and again in the Psalm where forgiveness will make us whiter than snow (Psalm 51:7).

The rose is on a BLUE, sky colored background symbolizing the yearning for the joy of a new life in heaven. God promises salvation to all believers who trust in Jesus Christ. This promise can brings peace and harmony to our Christian faith.

Last but not least we have a GOLD circle that surrounds the Luther Rose. The circle symbolizes that our salvation in heaven is endless and has no end. Just as gold is precious and valuable the grace and blessings that God gives us are precious, valuable and endless.

Try to remember the meanings as you observe the Luther Rose on the paraments you will see on Noisy Offering Sunday.

Looking for a Delicious Winter Soup? This one was served at our first Lenten Soup Supper.

CARROT AND LEEK SOUP

1 medium leek, thinly sliced

4 tsp. butter

6 medium carrots, sliced

2 medium potatoes, peeled and cubed

3 cans (14 1/2 oz.) chicken broth

2 cups milk OR half and half

1/8 tsp. pepper



In a large sauce pan, saute leeks in butter until tender. Add carrots, potatoes and broth and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat, cover and simmer until the vegetables are tender. Cool to room temperature.

Use a blender to puree vegetables (or mash with a potato masher). Return pureed vegetables to saucepan, stir in milk (or half and half) and pepper; heat thoroughly.

Yields: 10 servings
